



WHO

Laura James is a self-taught painter of
Antiguan heritage. Working as a professional artist
and illustrator for over twenty years, her sacred art is
rendered in the Ethiopian Christian Art style, which over
the years she has made her own. Ms. James is best known
for her illustrations in the Book of the Gospels lectionary
published in 2000 by Liturgy Training Publications on behalf
of the Roman Catholic Church, which achieved a Catholic
Press Association 2002 Book Award. The Book of the
Gospels receives accolades from parishes who daily proclaim
the holy Gospel at Catholic Mass. The book is used worldwide
by numerous Christian denominations. Laura's religious art is
at the forefront of the movement toward a more inclusive
representation of Biblical figures.

This would be Laura's second rendition of the 14 Stations of the Cross, the first was commissioned by Nativity RC Church located in South Los Angeles in 2003.

From Here To Haiti, Ltd., a 501(c) (3) public charity, was formed in 2010 to respond to the increasing need for repair of buildings used for public assembly. The Corporation focuses primarily on Catholic and/or Christian places of worship and their related structures, including but not limited to rectories, cisterns, parish schools, community centers and clinics built by or otherwise maintained by the Church. FHTH seeks to create local employment opportunities for the people of Haiti through that repair work. Since its inception, FHTH has completed 5 major projects and is currently involved in 6 more at various stages. FHTH will be the organization to accept donations on behalf of The Stations for Sassier Project. Donations are fully tax deductible (subject to the provisions of IRC Section 170)

Zanmi Sasye-Partners with Sassier is a not for profit organization which partners with groups in the Sassier area to bring hope, create opportunity and improve lives for the 10,000 inhabitants living there. Since 2006, they have provided or facilitated more than \$1 million in direct assistance and investment in the Sassier area.

Their work builds upon and complements efforts begun in 1998 by Sacred Heart Parish in Winnetka, Illinois. Since 1999, Sacred Heart Parish has been twinned with the Parish of St. Jean Baptiste. Through their Haiti Ministry Committee and the generosity of their Parishioners, they have sought to develop a two-way relationship with the people of St. Jean Baptiste —through prayers, sharing and understanding of each other's culture and needs.






WHERE

The parish of St. Jean Baptiste, founded in 1996, serves about 10,000 people over about 30 square miles in a rural area in southwestern Haiti. The Stations will be installed at St. Jean Baptiste Church, the Parish church which serves 3 chapels.

Partners with Sassier are also involved with the College Pierre Toussaint, which is located in St. Jean Baptiste Parish. The College has been supported generously by the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund of the Archdiocese of New York.

In the words of Br. Tyrone Davis, CSC, the director of the Fund, "We are returning to Haiti a small portion of the gift they shared with us more than 200 years ago—the spirit, dedication and passion of Venerable Pierre Toussaint."

The College has engendered the transformation of the community.










St. Jean Baptiste Church in Sassier, Haiti
